UPPER GASTROINTESTINAL SURGERY

I have a specialist interest is in the management of upper gastrointestinal diseases. My current post incorporates a busy specialist clinical practice with local and tertiary referrals for complicated upper gastrointestinal problems. I have a personal series of over 300 oesophageal resections and am actively involved in the development of regional services for upper gastro-intestinal diseases. I have been a member of council for the Association of Upper Gastrointestinal Surgeons of Great Britain

Over the past fourteen years I have established a centre of excellence for upper gastrointestinal surgery in Portsmouth. My aim is to use this as a basis for the development of clinical and basic science research, and training programs within this field.

MINIMALLY INVASIVE SURGERY

I have extensive experience of minimally invasive (laparoscopic) surgery. I have performed over 1000 cholecystectomies (including cholangiography) and have further developed the emerging techniques of appendicectomy, inguinal hernia repair, colo-rectal resection, patch repair of perforated duodenal ulcer, vagotomy and gastro-jejunostomy, and anti-reflux surgery. I have developed techniques for 'minimising' laparoscopic procedures for adaptation to day-case procedures in selected patients. I teach laparoscopic surgical techniques on a number of postgraduate courses at both basic and advanced level.

BARIATRIC (OBESITY) SURGERY

Over the last eight years I have developed one of the most active and successful NHS Bariatric Surgery Units in the South of England. The unit now comprises 4 specialist surgeons and a complete multi-disciplinary team. The team now provides both NHS and Independent sector Bariatric Surgery to a wide geographical area. I have a personal series of over 2000 major procedures, including revisional surgery.

CAREER DEVELOPMENT AND ASPIRATIONS

During my first eight years in Portsmouth established a Unit with a sound reputation for Upper Gastrointestinal Surgery. This has led to the establishment of Portsmouth as one of the few recognised National Upper Gastro-Intestinal Cancer Centres. My own ambition is to foster a collaborative multi-disciplinary unit which embraces current medical practice and ongoing



research. I am particularly interested in projectes that bridge the 'gap' between laboratory and patient.

I am also pursuing the development of Bariatric services as a mentor and initiator of services. I have assisted the development of NHS services at Oxford, NW London, Basingstoke and Portsmouth.

My ambition would be to work as a senior partner of a specialist surgical practice providing high quality surgery throughout the South of England.
